Rehabilitation of "Flowing rope with birdlime hunt" and "Wide rectangle net hunt" to waterfowl.




"Flowing rope with birdlime hunt" and "wide rectangle net hunt" were performed at Tega marsh (Chiba) and Kasumigaura lake (Ibaraki) until 1945, legitimately. There were also cases at Sado island (Niigata, Japan sea) and Biwa lake (Shiga).

The role of the public museums of Ibaraki Prefecture and Sado city (Niigata Prefecture) is big in folklore after new political system from 1945.


"Flowing rope with birdlime hunt" had been held from 14century at Tega Marsh, from the information of Higashi-Katsushika-County magazine around about 1880's years.

"Flowing rope with birdlime hunt" had been held at offshore, and "Wide rectangle net hunt" had been installed at shallows close to shore. Both 2 type hunt methods had been run at the same time.
